This book is not intended to encourage an archaeological itch nor does the author, in a phrase once used by Mr. John Betjeman in introducing an anthology, guarantee that the writers quoted are necessarily 'all right'. It is a personal selection from a wide variety of writings which relate in a broad sense to the history and progress of British archaeology. It is, in brief, a selective prospect of British antiquity.

In the items chosen, some telling degree of literary qualification has generally been applied: comments on some feature of the age, some nicety of manner, some strong contrast in a point of view, these too have influenced selection.

Advance readers say that this is a book for edification, entertainment, and real enjoyment for antiquary and general reader alike.

Ronald Jessup, a well-known Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries, has written several books and many papers on various aspects of archaeology. His last book *Puzzle of the Past* was most warmly acclaimed in its English, American, and foreign editions.

The history of the notion of 'soul-journeys' in Greek and Latin literature is among the many topics treated in this study.
