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Agreements on Extradition and Mutual Legal Assistance between the United States of America and the European Union

These agreements provide new mechanisms for cooperation between the US and the EU on international criminal law enforcement matters.

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German Federal Constitutional Court: In the Proceedings on the Constitutional Complaint of Mr. Al-M., and His Motion for a Temporary Injunction

The German Federal Constitutional Court found that the extradition treaty between Germany and the United States did not require German courts to examine whether there was sufficient evidence for the charge.

ICTY: Prosecutor v. Galic

Trial Chamber I found General Stanislav Galic guilty of violations of the laws or customs of war for acts of violence with the primary purpose of spreading terror among the civilian population, in violation of Article 51 of the Additional Protocol I to the Geneva Conventions of 1949 and under Article 3 of the ICTY Statute.

Permanent Court of Arbitration: Reineccius et al. v. Bank for International
Settlements

The Tribunal in its final award unanimously decided that the Bank for International Settlements was required to pay compensation for the shares that had been recalled by the Bank on January 8, 2001.



WTO: United States — Anti-Dumping Act of 1916 (Original Complaint by the European Communities)

The Panel held that the European Communities may suspend obligations under GATT 1994 and the Anti-Dumping Agreement against imports from the United States. The European Communities must ensure that the application of this suspension is quantified, and does not exceed the quantified level of nullification or impairment it has sustained as a result of the 1916 Act.

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
