FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

The Center for Chinese Studies would like to announce a newly-established fellowship program designed to assist foreign Sinologists to carry out research in the R.O.C. The program is open to professors, associate professors, assistant professors, and doctoral candidates at university departments concerned with Chinese Studies, which are located outside the Republic of China. The program is also open to researchers at research institutions outside the R.O.C. that are related to the field of Chinese Studies.

Research subjects should fall within the field of Chinese Studies. However, subjects related to contemporary Chinese politics, economics, or the military are excluded, since the research work of these subjects is sponsored by other institutions.

The fellowship provides a research subsidy based on the length of research tenure in the R.O.C., which is set at a period of three months to one year. Scholars in need of travel funds may also apply for travel grants to the R.O.C. The final deadline for receipt of applications and all supporting materials is October 31 of any given year, for research projects beginning after July 1 of the following year.
