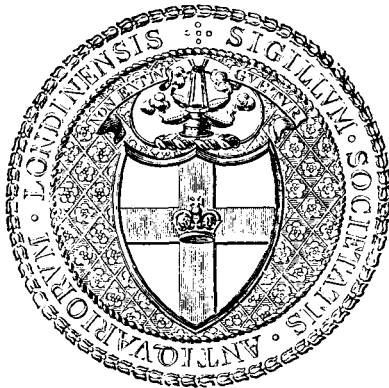

THE DOME OF THE ROCK IN JERUSALEM

By E. T. Richmond. This book is a description of its structure and decoration. THE STATUTES GOVERNING THE CATHEDRAL CHURCH OF WINCHESTER, given by Charles I
