In submitting manuscripts, please send four clear copies. Author's name should appear *only* on an unpaginated cover sheet, with address and essay's title. No other identifying reference to author should appear on the manuscript. All references to author's work in text or notes should be in the third person. Essay's title should appear at top of first page of text. Notes should be placed on separate sheets at end. Full double spacing should be used throughout, including indented quotations and notes. Top, bottom, and right-hand margins should be at least one inch; left-hand margins at least one-and-a-half. Manuscripts should be accompanied by an abstract of one hundred fifty words or less and an author vita of one hundred words or less. Authors should state that the manuscript will not be submitted to another journal until *Horizons'* evaluation is completed. Manuscripts will be returned if postage is supplied.

Articles appearing in *Horizons* are abstracted and indexed in: *The Catholic Periodical and Literature Index*; *Guide to Social Science and Religion in Periodical Literature*; *Index to Religious Periodical Literature*; *New Testament Abstracts*; *Religious and Theological Abstracts*; and *Social Science Citation Index*. Articles are indexed in *Religion Index One: Periodicals*; book reviews indexed in *Index to Book Reviews in Religion*. *Horizons* is available in microform from Bell & Howell, 300 North Zeeb Road, P.O. Among our Articles are items relating to practical theology, moral theology, Ramana Maharshi, and John Henry Newman. Michael Lawler reflects on the relationship between sociology and theology in "Faith, Praxis, and Practical Theology." Mary Elsbernd does some close comparative textual analysis in "The Reinterpretation of *Gaudium et spes* in *Veritatis splendor*." Thomas Forsthoefel examines the appeal of Ramana Maharshi in "Weaving the Inward Thread to Awakening." And John Connolly considers how Newman can help us better understand "Theology in a Catholic University."

Our Editorial Essays include Edmund Chia on "*Dominus Iesus* and Asian Theologies" and William Thompson-Uberuaga on "Continuity Amidst Disruption: The Spirit and Apostolic Succession at the Reformation." Our Editorial Symposium, "Roman Catholic Theology of Tradition," edited by Paul Lakeland, features the recent work of Terrence Tilley and John Thiel, with the authors responding to reflections by Roger Haight, Kathryn Tanner, and Orlando Espín.

Our Review Symposium focuses on *Communion Ecclesiology* by Dennis Doyle, who responds to reviews by Susan Wood, Michael Baxter, Bradford Hinze, and Jamie Phelps. Then, in a Review Essay, Michael Barnes considers the works of several authors involved in the discussion about "Intelligent Design: The New Creationism." Finally, we have reviews of thirty new books.
