THE CONTRIBUTORS

Sten Sparre Nilson is Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Oslo, Norway. In addition to books in Norwegian, he has published *Histoire et sciences politiques: Essai sur la méthode quantitative* (1950) and *Knut Hamsun und die Politik* (1964). He was Visiting Research Associate at the Center of International Studies, Princeton University, in 1966-1967.

WALKER CONNOR, Associate Professor of Government at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York, is now working on a study of the relationships between nationalism and communism.

W. B. Sherwood is a long-time political observer and reporter of Middle Eastern affairs. He is fluent in Turkish and observed the formation and rise of the Justice party during a several years' residence in Turkey.

J. MAYONE STYCOS is Professor of Sociology, Chairman of the Department of Sociology, and Director of the International Population Program at Cornell University. He is Senior Consultant on Latin America to the Population Council and is the author of books on population problems in Jamaica, Puerto Rico, and Latin America, the most recent of which is *The Population Dilemma in Latin America* (with Jorge Arias, 1966).

ROBERT D. PUTNAM is a graduate student in political science at Yale. He is in Europe this year doing doctoral research on the basic political beliefs and values of parliamentarians and civil servants in Britain and Italy.

SIDNEY VERBA, Professor of Political Science at Stanford University, is coauthor of *The Civic Culture* (1963) and coeditor and coauthor of *Political Culture and Political Development* (1965). He is directing a cross-national study of political development.

HENRY BIENEN is the author of Tanzania: Party Transformation and Economic Development and the editor of and a contributor to The Military Intervenes: A Case Study Approach to Political Change, both scheduled for publication in 1967. He is Assistant Professor of Politics and a Faculty Associate of the Center of International Studies at Princeton.

T. V. SATHYAMURTHY, a member of the Department of Politics at the University of Strathclyde, has recently occupied academic positions at the University of Indiana, the University of Singapore, the University of East Africa, and Northwestern University. His book Politics of International Cooperation: Conceptions of UNESCO was published in 1964, and he is now at work on The Politics of Modern Uganda, to be published next year.
