This work, arranged alphabetically by jurisdiction, provides the user with relevant information on sources of foreign law including complete bibliographic citations to legislation, the existence of English translations whenever possible, indications of currentness of the legal materials listed, and selected references to secondary sources in English.

Each section has an introduction which describes the particular country's legal system and mentions the major English-language books on the laws of that country. A subject breakdown with

citation to sources and translations enables the user to ascertain what laws are operative in a particular subject area.

Volume 1 covers the Western Hemisphere; volume 2 covers Western and Eastern Europe and the European Communities; volume 3, to be published in July 1993, covers Africa, Asia and Australasia.


