This volume of The Collected Works L contains essays published by Eric Voegelin between 1929 and 1933, the period between the publication of his first book, On the Form of the American Mind, and Hitler's rise to power, as well as Voegelin's two books analyzing the explosive race issues posed by National Socialism. 264 pages, \$49.95

This volume presents a meditativeexegetic study of texts from Augustine, Descartes, and Husserl, early examples of the meditations that became central to Voegelin's later work. Other essays included in this volume such as "The Theory of Law" and "Political Science as Human Science" develop these theoretical insights and refine Voegelin's methodological tools. 544 pages, \$59.95
