SYMPOSIUM AND PRACTICAL WORKSHOP ON MAXILLOFACIAL INJURIES

17-20 NOVEMBER 1971

The University of Iowa Department of Otolaryngology and Maxillofacial Surgery will hold a Symposium (17–19 November) and a Practical Workshop (19–20 November) on all aspects of Maxillofacial and related Injuries.

The Symposium will include lectures, panel discussions, and informal Question and Answer periods by leading authorities in the field among Plastic Surgeons and Otorhinolaryngologists.

Acute and old injuries of the soft and hard tissues will be discussed, as well as injuries to the eyelids, the auricle, and the larynx and trachea. The Practical Workshop will cover suture techniques, flaps and Z-plasties, for which suitable fresh animal material will be provided. Instruction will also be given in applied dental anatomy; intermaxillary fixation will be practised on articulated dental casts.
