The Bentham Project, in conjunction with the International Bentham Society and members of various departments of University College London, has arranged a one-day symposium at University College London on 26 September 1989 on the life and work of Sir John Bowring, merchant, traveller, linguist, editor, Unitarian activist, radical MP, diplomat, and colonial governor. The symposium will represent the first attempt to examine Bowring's work as a whole. Contributors will include: Mr. G. F.
