Digest of Strasbourg Case-Law relating to the European Convention on Human Rights

This Digest covers the period 1955 to 1982. It is the result of several years of collaboration between the Directorate of Human Rights of the Council of Europe and the Europa Instituut of the University of Utrecht (Netherlands).

Between the entry into force of the European Convention on Human Rights and more particularly the constitution of the European Commission and Court of Human Rights (in 1954 and 1959 respectively) and 31 December 1981, more than 9 500 individual applications and 13 inter-state applications have been registered with the Commission of Human Rights. Among them, 59 cases involving 87 applications have been brought before the Court and 51 cases concerning 99 applications have been decided by the Committee of Ministers.
