

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The Birth of Heart Surgery:

Lessons from the "Blue Baby" Operation

enowned cardiac surgeons Jeffrey Jacobs, M.D., and Duke Cameron, M.D., of the Johns Hopkins All Children's Heart Institute held an informal dinner conversation about the birth of pediatric heart surgery at the World Congress of Paediatric Cardiology & Cardiac Surgery. With a panel of international experts, they chronicled the first successful repair of tetralogy of Fallot, a devastating heart malformation once deemed universally fatal. They explored the development of the Blalock-Taussig shunt by Alfred Blalock, Helen Taussig, and Vivien Thomas at Johns Hopkins in 1944, known as the "Blue Baby" operation, which revolutionized the treatment of pediatric heart disease and ushered in a new era of cardiac surgery. They also reviewed the pathology, diagnosis, incidence, treatment and prognosis of tetralogy of Fallot.
