**Yucatan Materials Microfilmed by University of Alabama**

The University of Alabama has recently completed the microfilming of materials in the library of the Instituto Yucateco de Antropología e Historia and the library of the state of Yucatan. To date, a total of 119 rolls of microfilm have been catalogued by the University of Alabama library.

**American Philosophical Society Sponsors Archival Work in Spain**

During the academic years 1967–68 and 1968–69, the American Philosophical Society has sponsored archival work in the Archivo de Indias, Sevilla, Spain. Supporting grants have been provided by the participating institutions—the University of Pennsylvania University Museum and Department of Anthropology and the Instituto de Cultura Hispánica, Madrid. The objectives of the program are to collect and microfilm documents containing information on Spaniards in the early colonial period in the New World, to make use of the documents for ethnographic reconstruction and interpretation of the culture of the societies of the period, and to train anthropology students in ethno-historical research. The first stage of the study has focused on documentation for Guatemala; documents concerned with varied aspects of the society of the
