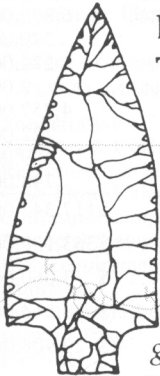

THE SAA DOCTORAL DISSERTATION PRIZE**

The Society for American Archaeology has established a prize to be awarded to individuals whose doctoral dissertations are judged to be particularly outstanding and important. The prize will consist of honorary lifetime membership in the SAA. In addition, the Society will endeavor to publish as many of these dissertations as possible.

Nominees must have defended their dissertations and have received their Ph.D. degrees in the three years prior to the current deadline (10/1/87) in order to be eligible. It is not necessary that a nominee already be a member of the SAA.

Non-student members of the SAA are encouraged to nominate students whose dissertations they consider to represent outstanding scholarship and original contributions to the field. At the time of nomination, nominees are to be informed of the fact, and they may then submit their papers in competition if they agree to adhere to the conditions of the competition and the prize (see *American Antiquity* 48[1] for details). All letters of nomination and three copies of all dissertations entered for consideration must be sent by October 1, 1987 to:
