International Organization Prize Award for 1966

The Board of Editors of *International Organization* is pleased to offer a 1966 Prize Award of \$300 and publication in *International Organization* to the author of the best adjudged manuscript submitted in the field of international organizational affairs by an author not more than 32 years of age.

The Prize Award competition for 1966 will be focused on the United Nations and the peaceful settlement of international disputes.

Authors may choose their own subject, but manuscripts will be considered only to the extent that they are related to the broader theme mentioned above.

Manuscripts must not exceed 30 double-spaced, $8\frac{1}{2}''$ by 11'', typewritten pages, including citations and footnotes. They should be plainly marked as manuscripts submitted for the Award, and must be accompanied by a *curriculum vitae* of the author, including the date and place of his birth. In order to be considered for the competition, the manuscript must be submitted by June 20, 1966, to the editorial office (40 Mt. Vernon Street, Boston, Massachusetts 02108).

In reviewing the manuscripts, the Board will pay particular attention to their scholarly character, originality, relevance to some aspect of the main theme, and quality of style and composition.

All manuscripts will become the property of the Board of Editors. The Board reserves the right to make no award if, in its judgment, no manuscript is deemed suitable for the Prize Award.
