ORIENTAL TRANSLATION FUND.

NEW SERIES.

THE attempt to revive the old Fund by Subscription and Donation having failed, it has now been decided, with the sanction of the Council of the Royal Asiatic Society, to print and publish translations of standard Oriental works in the following manner:—

1st. All members of the Royal Asiatic Society can print and publish at their own expense, or at the expense of the Fund, either their own translations or those of other persons.

2nd. The names of any translated works proposed to be issued should be submitted, in the first instance, to the Permanent Committee appointed by the Council. This Committee will examine these proposals, determine if any pecuniary assistance can be obtained or granted, and, finally, submit the matter to the Council for their sanction.

3rd. With the sanction of the Council, these works can then be printed and published by the Translator or Editor under the patronage of the Royal Asiatic Society. They can be kept and sold at the rooms of the Society, 22, Albemarle Street, London, and advertised in their Quarterly Journal free of expense.

4th. The works can be printed and bound in an uniform manner, though this is not absolutely necessary. The numerical number under the New Series will indicate the language from which the translation is made, *i.e.* under I. all Persian works; II. Arabic; III. Sanskrit; IV. Hebrew, and so on.

The following volumes are now ready for sale and delivery at the office of the Oriental Translation Fund, New Series, Royal Asiatic Society, 22, Albemarle Street, W., and at all booksellers.

Part I. Volume I. of Mirkhond's General History [Rauzat-us-safa] translated from the Persian by Mr. E. Rehatsek, and containing the Moslem version of our Bible stories, from the creation of Genii before Adam up to the death of Aaron. Price, Ten Shillings.

Part I. Volume II. of the above continuing the same from the death of Moses to the mission of I'sa [Jesus], about whose birth, life, and death, many details are given; also the biographies of Alexander the Great, of certain philosophers, and of the kings of the first four Persian dynasties, etc., etc. Price, Ten Shillings.

In 1893 and 1894 there will be published in three volumes Part II. of the above history. The first two volumes will contain Mirkhond's Life of Muhammad the Apostle, with an Appendix about his wives, concubines, children, secretaries, alms-gatherers, servants, freed men and women, as recorded in the Habib-us-siar of Khondemir, the son of the author of the Rauzat-us-safa. The third volume will contain the lives of Muhammad's immediate successors, viz., Abu Bakr, Omar, Othman, and Ali.
