The Renaissance Society of America is pleased to announce a new program of support for scholarly publishing in Renaissance studies.

Members and nonmembers are invited to submit proposals for subsidy of the following categories of publications:

Editions of Renaissance texts of interdisciplinary importance, normally restricted to Latin, Greek, and Hebrew.

English translations of similar texts and documents, particularly from the Latin.

Facsimile editions, with appropriate introductions, of rare Renaissance publications or manuscripts not suited to commercial reprint ventures.

Publications subsidized by the Society would bear on the title page an appropriate acknowledgement stating that the volume is published "in conjunction with The Renaissance Society of America."

Procedures for Submitting Proposals

Applications

Proposals should contain the following information:

- 1. Brief account of the publication, its importance for Renaissance studies.
- 2. Curriculum vitae of the applicant.
- 3. Budget submitted by a publisher who has agreed to publish the item to be subsidized.
- Facts of publication—how many copies, how to be distributed, royalty arrangements, editorial services, illustrations, binding, etc.
- 5. Expected schedule of publication.
- Amount requested, when payment desired, and specification
 of how the Renaissance Society might recover some of its outlay.
- 7. Two confidential reviews of the manuscript obtained by the publisher.

The applications will be reviewed by the Committee on Publications Subsidies. It may request a copy of the manuscript and seek external consultations.
