In the varying accounts of the Lord's Supper, what goes back to Jesus and what originated in the early church? Drawing upon the accounts of outstanding European observers of the American scene the author gives an outsider's view of religion in America from 1837 to 1923. The two key motifs which dominate the impressions of these outsiders were, one, the separation of church and state, and, two, its surprisingly healthful consequences.

The Protestant attempt to Christianize American society during the nineteenth century was frustrated by two factors. First, the seriousness with which the churches tried to meet and influence society tended to make them absorb the characteristics of those they served. Second, American culture became increasingly less homogeneous after the Civil War.

From his study of manuscripts and rare books, some of which were only recently made available, Mr. Kingdon offers an analysis and evaluation of fresh information about the two major problems which dominated Protestant activity in France from the time of John Calvin's death in 1564 to the eruption of the St. Bartholomew's Day massacre in 1572.

The problem of how the Reformed Church should be organized resulted in the first consideration of the relative merits of "congregational" and "presbyterian" church polity. The question of how the Reformed Church should deal with the French state in order to achieve religious toleration was less peaceably resolved. One faction in the Church was prepared to endure bitter persecution, but the other group wanted to wage war against the state and twice plunged France into civil war, until the massacres of Protestants in 1572 nearly wiped out the movement in many parts of France.

Robert M. Kingdon is Professor of History at the University of Wisconsin and author of Geneva and the Coming of the Wars of Religion in France, 1555-1563 (Geneva: Droz, 1956), to which the book is a sequel. \$8.00
