### ARISTOTLE AND THE ARABS

The Aristotelian Tradition in Islam

by F. E. Peters.

Greek science and philosophy introduced the Muslim conquerors of the Near East to the rich legacy of Hellenic learning. The most significant part of that inheritance was Aristotle, and the Christians, Jews, and Muslim Arabs who worked and lived under Islam fashioned from Aristotelianism an elaborate structure that was in part Hellenic and in part the offspring of their own tradition.

In this first real synthesis on Islamic Aristotelianism, Dr. Peters cites translations wherever available, so that the work will be useful even to those who have no Arabic. The book is the first in a new series, *New York University Studies in Near Eastern Civilization*.
