Our Saviour and His Love for Us

By Rev. R. GARRIGOU-LAGRANGE, O.P. Translated by A. Bouchard. 410 pages. 45/-

This present work on our Saviour's love for us rests on two revealed truths: the Mystery of the Incarnation and the Mystery of the Redemption. Nothing better manifests that love than these two Mysteries.

To an unusual degree, this theological treatise is permeated with warmth and unction since Father Garrigou-Lagrange is addressing particularly souls that are seriously striving for spiritual perfection.

The Theology of Religious Vocation

The primary aim of this work is to evolve from general theological doctrine about religious vocation certain practical principles which can be used profitably by confessors and spiritual advisers in their task of guiding prospective candidates for the religious life.

The candidate's qualifications, especially the interior ones, are treated with an extensive consideration of the virtue of magnanimity. The last portion of the book points out the rôle of the family and of the priests in the fostering of religious vocations.

The Nature of Law

By Rev. T. E. DAVITT, S.J., PH.D. 279 pages. 30/-

What is the basis of a citizen's obligation in conscience to obey a just law? Does the command or prohibition of legal enactments issue from the will or from the intellect? What is a penal law, and in what respect does it bind under pain of sin?

These questions, which have been mooted among philosophers and theologians for many centuries, are discussed and critically examined by Fr Davitt.
