Call for Papers: Autobiography and Changing Identities conference to be held July 27-30, 2000. This conference at UBC will focus on autobiographies that involve a significant displacement or reconstruction of "self" and identity on the part of the autobiographical subject, including, but not limited to: Autobiographies of trauma; Autobiographies around themes of multiculturalism, diaspora, and migration; Autobiographies of nation (i.e. self/subject and community, self/subject and "nation," including First Nations); Autobiographies around themes of gender and sexuality; Autobiographies of social class.

We are particularly interested in papers that explore non-literary as well as literary uses of the autobiographical in relation to these topics, addressing autobiographical representation in: Popular culture, Visual art, Oral histories, Performance art, Anthropological literature, Film, Dance.

The conference language will be English. Proposals (500-750 words) should outline clearly the scope of the paper and its aims. Twenty minutes will be allowed for each presentation.
