These ten volumes (available as a set or separately) constitute an almost unsurpassed bibliography relating to drama and theater up through the mid-19th century. There are almost 15,000 separate citations which, though strongest in French plays of all periods, cover also the English, Oriental, Greek, Latin and neo-Latin, Italian, Spanish, German, and other European theaters.

Included are collections of manuscripts, prints, and drawings. Also works on ballet and the burlesque and satiric theater. There are two volumes of indices: one with the original work, and the whole buttressed by an analytic index of almost 500 pages published by Rothschild. The De Filippi and Pont de Vesle volumes augment and complement the main Soleinne catalogue.

Bibliographers seem to be unanimous in their general estimate of this collection: "A very useful collection from ancient times through the first part of the 19th century. Particularly strong in French theater and including works of many European countries." (Winchell, R606). Archer Taylor in Book Catalogues: their varieties and uses (1957) (pp. 122–123) equates the Soleinne catalogue with the Hoe, Huth, Ashley, and Pforzheimer collections in its specialized field.
