How can we achieve all this?

We hope to encourage the involvement of a greater number of ASTIN members with their journal by clearly defining several sections for each of the forthcoming issues.

- 1. Editorial and Announcements
- 2. Articles: Under this heading we should like to publish papers along the traditional ASTIN lines.
- 3. Workshop: This should be the forum for interaction between real application and theoretical modelling.
- 4. Letters to the Editors: With this section we are starting an experiment. In principle, we invite reactions and possibly suggestions from the readership about papers published in ASTIN BULLETIN. The experiment may become critical if we get either too few or too many letters, but let's cross that bridge when we come to it!

We must stress that the structure of the bulletin provides only a framework, which we invite you to use. The success of ASTIN BULLETIN depends on all the individual contributors. Please help us to make ASTIN BULLETIN the breeding ground for the symbiotic culture of true practical applications and high quality methodological research.
