EDITORIAL POLICY

Applied Psycholinguistics publishes papers reporting work in which applied problems are approached from the standpoint of basic research and theory in experimental, developmental and social psycholinguistics and related areas of cognitive psychology.

Applied Psycholinguistics encompasses work on both normal and disordered language and communicative development in children and normal and disordered language and communicative functioning in adults. Articles and notes may deal with processes (e.g., underlying representations, linguistic production, comprehension and memory), etiology (where appropriate), development, social and other environmental interactions, assessment, intervention and pedagogy, but must reflect the journal's basic research and theory orientation toward applied psycholinguistics.

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
