The house provides men and women with a community centre, where they will find and themselves help to form a well-developed Catholic life. It is spacious and cheerful, with modern amenities including central heating. It stands in the grounds and parkland of Hawkesyard Priory and, as a central meeting-place, is easily reached from all parts of England and Wales.

Throughout the year courses are arranged to cover a wide variety of interests. Catholic societies and organisations also book it for their meetings. In the priory church visitors are able to follow the daily ceremonies of the liturgy. The priory has a community of some forty priests, students and laybrothers.

Spode House lies between Stafford and Lichfield, just off the London-Manchester road (A.51) and close to the Euston-Glasgow and Euston-Manchester main line, as well as to roads and railways out of Birmingham.
