FPS Meeting

Because of the industrial difficulties this issue of *Oryx* may be very late in appearing. Members have already been informed in a special leaflet of the meeting on March 26, in the Zoo Meeting Rooms, at which John Aspinall, conservationist and owner of a famous animal collection at Howletts, in Kent, will speak and show a film of Howletts. We hope also to have Dr John A. Spence, of McGill University, Montreal, to speak on the impact of large-scale developments on wildlife in Canada.

Wildlife Tours

Details of two 1974 tours—one to Rwanda and Zaïre (formerly Congo and the other to Zambia and Botswana—were sent to members in the British Isles and Europe in February. We very much regret that the time factor made it impossible to circularise overseas members at this time, but we hope to repeat the Rwanda and Zaïre tour in 1975.

Subscription Renewals

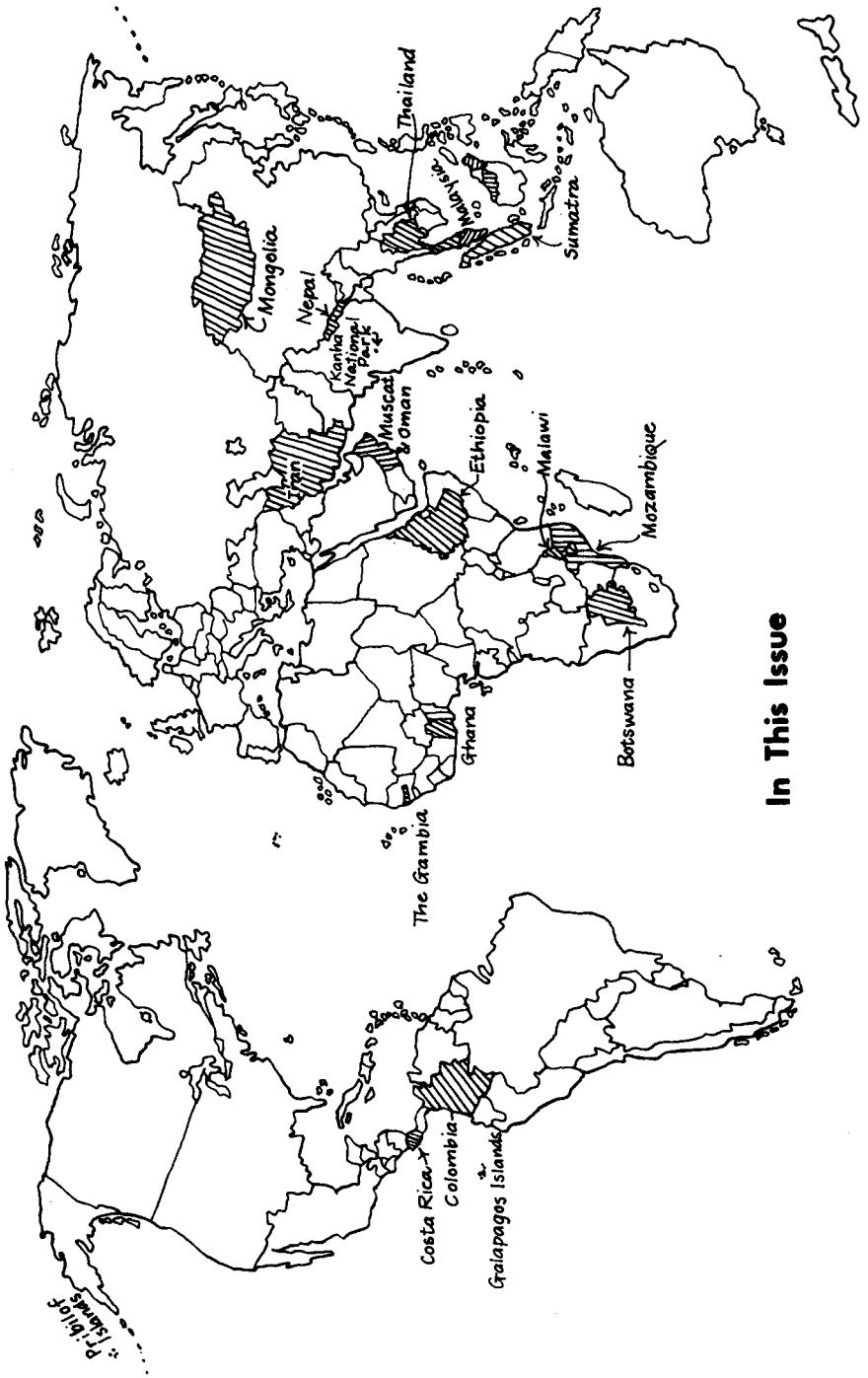
