The annual institutional subscription rate is \$30.00, postage included. Subscribers also receive the annual Bibliography and semiannual Professional Review. Single issues of the Journal and Bibliography, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$8.00 plus postage and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S.
