The first special issue will focus on "Drug Control Policy: A Historical Perspective" and will appear in Summer 1991, edited by William O. Walker. The JPH welcomes contributors to this special issue. The interests of these scholars—legal history, civil rights, electoral behavior, and environmental/regulatory policy, respectively—coincide with the interests of the JPH readers and authors.
