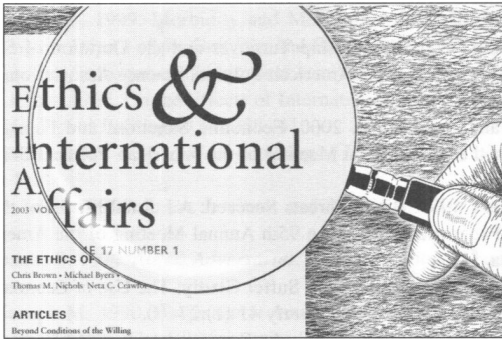

The Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard University awards approximately 30 fully funded residential fellowships each year designed to support postdoctoral scholars and scientists, as well as writers and artists of exceptional promise and demonstrated accomplishment. Applicants must have received their doctorate or appropriate terminal degree by December 2002 in the area of the proposed project. The stipend amount is \$50,000. Fellows receive office space and access to libraries and other resources of Harvard University. During the fellowship year, which extends from September 13, 2004 through June 30, 2005, residence in the Boston area is required, as is participation in the Institute community.

Applications must be postmarked by October 1, 2003.
