The Chronology of Neo-Assyrian Art

T. A. W. MADHLOOM

The art of the later years of the Assyrian Empire, from the ninth to the end of the seventh century B.C., provides the material for Dr Madhloom's detailed study of the stylistic development of Neo-Assyrian art. He discusses the most important features portrayed on Assyrian reliefs: chariots and siege engines, armour and weapons, costume, and guardian figures, tracing their chronological development and considering their value as dating criteria. An important part of this discussion is the examination of the reciprocal influence of Assyria and her neighbours which can be deduced from the shapes of chariots and weapons and also from the style of dress represented. The book is illustrated with line drawings of exceptional clarity by the author.

These magnificently illustrated volumes, printed on art paper, contain the first complete account of the work conducted under the auspices of the British School of Archaeology in Iraq at Nimrud between the years 1949 and 1963. The discoveries at Nimrud have a bearing which goes beyond the world of Assyria to the confines of the Mediterranean and as far as Greece and Etruria. These volumes should be indispensable to any library concerned with the history and archaeology of Western Asia and the Levant. The discoveries should also be of particular interest to art historians and to all who are concerned with the history of ancient craftsmanship. These are extensive accounts of many hundreds of ancient texts discovered in the course of the excavations.
