It traces the course of the campaign from the Normandy Bridgehead right through to the occupation of Germany and the end of the war in Europe. Perhaps the most harrowing section of this book is the one which describes the appalling conditions encountered in the German prison camp at Sandbostel and the heroic efforts made by the medical services to cope with the disease and degradation found there.
