continued to publish works in all branches of Physics almost to the end of his long life.

For his distinguished work in Physics he was elected a Foreign Member of the Royal Society of London in 1879, and a Foreign Honorary Member of this Society in 1889. He died on 13th January 1924, aged 89 years. (For fuller information regarding Quincke's work, see *Nature*, 23rd February 1924.)

SORLEY, JAMES, late of 73 Onslow Square, South Kensington, London, was elected a Fellow of the Society in 1882, and died suddenly at Cannes on 5th February 1924.

WILSON, GEORGE, M.A., M.D., D.P.H. (Camb.), LL.D. (Edin.), was educated at Edinburgh and Leipzig Universities. He was an Honorary Fellow of the Incorporated Society of Medical Officers of Health; a Fellow of the Royal Sanitary Institute; a Member of the Royal Commission on Vivisection, 1906; and Medical Officer of Health of the Mid-Warwick Comb. District. Dr Wilson was the author of A Handbook of Hygiene, 8th edition, 1898; Healthy Life and Healthy Dwellings, 1880; Sanitary Defects in Rural Districts, and How to Remedy Them, 1876; Health and Exercise, 1876; and of papers in the Edinburgh Medical Journal, etc.

He was elected a Fellow of this Society in 1882, and died on 11th September 1921 at his residence in Colwyn Bay.
