Hand-crafted from pine with a clear finish, they include trucks, cars, aeroplanes, trains, animals.

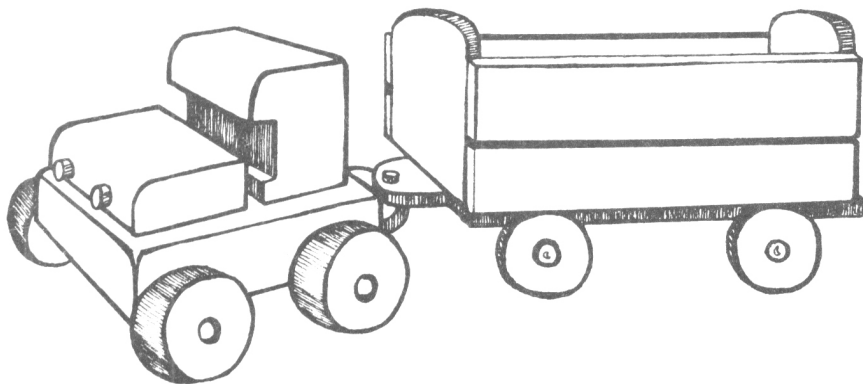

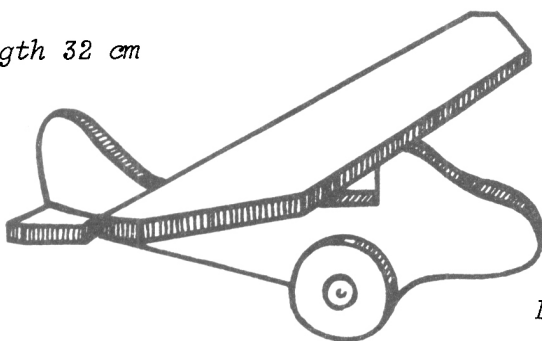

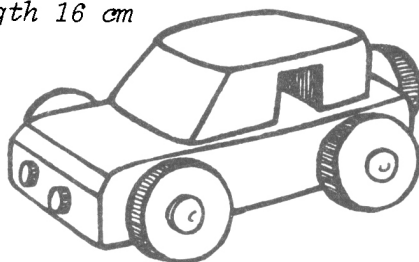
