DHSS Child Sexual Abuse Training Programme

The Institute of Child Health, London in conjunction with the Hospital for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street invite applications for this two day per week 12 month multi-disciplinary post-professional qualification training programme in child sexual abuse at the Institute of Child Health, London. The aims of the course are to enhance assessment and treatment skills in child sexual abuse, and to assist in the development of training in local communities, with a view to the development of a co-ordinated, structured, multi-disciplinary service delivery to CSA victims and their families. The course consists of one day per week study day and one day per week placement, and is available to a limited number of professionals from the fields of social work, clinical psychology, child psychiatry and community paediatrics.
