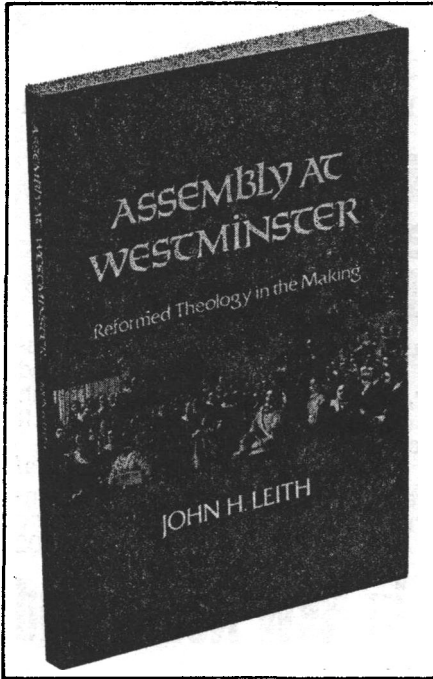

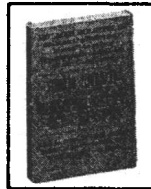

By placing it in historical perspective, Mr. Jones shows that the Great Awakening brought to the surface conflicting trends that had been developing for a century. In a detailed analysis of the major religious thinkers of the seventeenth century he reveals that the early New England Puritans synthesized many themes which later generations found contradictory. Over the course of the century we see this balance weakened and gradually broken. At the time of the Great Awakening two groups emerged: the liberals, emphasizing humanism and the evangelical Calvinists, stressing divine sovereignty. Each side was both heir to and a modifier of the founding faith. What was lost, however, was the concern for balance and synthesis of the first generation: where men were once anxious to harmonize, now two camps faced one another, each armed with half their fathers' vision. \$8.75

In tracing the stormy career of Samuel Johnson, Joseph Ellis explores the intellectual and cultural forces in New England at a time when religions, education, and politics were undergoing drastic changes. The ultimate significance of Johnson's career was perhaps as much political as it was religious; much as his Puritan ancestors in England had protested the union of state and church, he found himself as an Anglican fighting a similar union of political power and Puritan faith in America. In pursuing this struggle he advocated greater independence of local vestries from the domination of the episcopal hierarchy in England. Thus Johnson inserted one more wedge into the widening split between church and state, and between colonies and mother country, and contributed to the growing secularization of American society. \$10.00
