*Wu Hung.* The funerary shrine of the Confucian scholar Wu Liang, created in A.D. 151, is the most important surviving pre-buddhist monument in China. The importance of the shrine lies in the beauty of its stone reliefs and the remarkably comprehensive iconography of its nearly 100 scenes. The authors address a wide range of problems, including the composition of the ruling elites, the evolution of eminent families, and the nature of the state and its administration. 272 pp., \$35.00

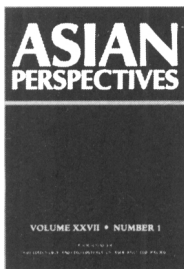
