

The self-portrait poses a challenge for the figurative artist. The reflection is so well-known it becomes one of the great unknowns. How to paint not just what is seen, but 'who' one is? I spent close to 40 years listening to other people talk about their lives, first as a psychiatric nurse, then as a researcher and psychotherapist. A few years ago I decided it was time to hear my own story. My paintings attempt to get inside stories from my life; expressing things which are beyond words. My early work tended to focus on echoes of others'



experiences within me; now I am overtaken with meditations on what it means to be 'me'. Some are tense, others humorous; all are absurd – like life. This painting means many things to me. I wonder what meaning does it conjure up in the viewer?
