Ours is an age of global insecurity. The devastation wrought by modern warfare, the threat of nuclear annihilation, and the widespread denial of human rights have renewed aspirations for universal justice and peace. To make genuine progress towards these goals, it is necessary to take into account the best of prior reflection and experience. This study explores the major conceptions which have arisen since the time when Dante, in his De Monarchia, sought to invest the Holy Roman Emperor with supreme global authority. The scope is impressive. Beginning with the attempt by Grotius in the 17th century to subject sovereign will to the reign of jurisprudence, it follows the developments in thought and action up to the precarious conditions of the contemporary world. Throughout the history of international relations, it has been assumed that global order can be achieved without the creation of universal political institutions. Drawing upon the insights of modern political theorists, Murphy maintains that the themes and concepts of political philosophy must be applied to the international realm if mankind is to approach the goal of permanent peace.
