This work, arranged alphabetically by jurisdiction, provides the user with relevant information on sources of foreign law including complete bibliographic citations to legislation, the existence of English translations whenever possible, indications of currentness of the legal materials listed, and finally, selected references to secondary sources in English.

Each section contains an introduction which describes the particular country's legal system and mentions the major English-language books on the laws of that country. A subject breakdown with citation to primary sources and translations enables the user to ascertain what laws are operative in a particular subject area.

Volume 1, published in December 1989, covers the Western Hemisphere. Volume 2, published in July 1991, covers Western and Eastern Europe and the European Communities. Volume 3, to be published in December 1992, will cover Africa, Asia and Australia.
