#### Theology in the Age of Renewal

#### CONCILIUM FIVE YEARS ON

Concilium started in January 1965 as a direct result of the fruitful and sometimes abrasive contact between bishops and theologians during Vatican II. A small group of people, Karl Rahner among them, felt the need at the end of the Council for an international vehicle that could pursue the primary themes to which several years of heightened theological awareness had given rise.

From small beginnings, Concilium quickly amassed a considerable world subscription and a total readership of over 100,000. It achieved this by expressing a lively and intelligent interest across the whole range of theological concern in 10 issues per annum, each of which was devoted to a particular field of

theology.

Originally planned for five years, the public demand for what had in the meantime become a successful journal of considerable importance to anyone who wished to keep abreast of theological speculation, the meaning of orthodoxy, and the implications of faith for social and political life, has led to agreement on another five-year run beginning in January 1970. Indeed, the continuing turbulence in Church and World, and the growing need for a mutual exchange of driving force and inspiration, suggests a greater need than ever for the only theological journal in the world that can bring these interests together by seeking and expressing comment and opinion from all quarters.
