what progress had been made in conservation since Mr. Gee's report of 1958—vide Oryx IV, 6.)

Operation Noah.—The audited receipts and expenditure account of the Kariba Fund, which is presented with this report, shows that £2,416 15s. 8d was received in gifts to the Society for Operation Noah, making a total public subscription of £13,868 11s. 9d. for 1959 and 1960. In 1960 £1,510 was sent to Africa (£10,500 in 1959). The expenses of the Fund in 1960 were £142 (£509 in 1959). The balance remaining in hand at the end of 1960 was £1,207. (A further £1,000 was sent to Africa in January, 1961.)

Acknowledgments.—The Council wish to express their thanks to Mr. R. S. R. Fitter for his articles in the Press.

Thanks are also offered to all those who gave lectures and showed films to the Society itself and to others on its behalf.

The Society is most grateful to the Zoological Society of London for office accommodation and for the unstinted help given by that Society's staff throughout the year.

ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 1960

We have completed the audit of the Books and Accounts of the Society for the year ended 31st December, 1960, and report thereon as follows :—

GENERAL PURPOSES ACCOUNT

The Balance of this Account at the end of the year was $\pounds 2,945$ 2s., after transferring $\pounds 30$ from the Life Membership Fund and deducting $\pounds 902$ 10s. 4d. being the excess of Expenditure over Income on the year's working.

The excess of Expenditure over Income in the previous year was £153 11s. 10d.

NUMBER OF MEMBERS AND ARREARS OF SUBSCRIPTIONS

The number of Members on the Roll at 31st December, 1960, was 1,912, made up as follows :—

At 31st December, 1960, there were 128 Members in arrear with their Subscriptions.

GENERAL RESERVE FUND

A further sum of £616 18s. has been placed to reserve, representing the amount of the donations and legacy received during the year. The balance on the Fund at 31st December, 1960, was $\pounds 9,974 2s$.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP FUND

The balance standing to the credit of the Fund is now £5,040 This is after crediting £460 in respect of Life Membership Subscriptions received during the year and transferring £30 to the General Purposes Account which represents the value of subscriptions of those Life Members whose membership ceased during the year.

INVESTMENTS

The total investments at 31st December, 1960, at Cost amounted to £17,934 9s., and the Market Value at that date was £18,219 15s. 5d., showing a net appreciation of £285 6s. 5d.

SURPLUS

The surplus of Assets over Liabilities at the end of the year amounted to $\pounds 17,959$ 4s., as compared with $\pounds 17,784$ 6s. at the end of the previous year.

" OPERATION NOAH "-KARIBA FUND

We have examined the transactions relating to this Fund, and annexed to the Society's Accounts is the Receipts and Payments Account for the year to 31st December, 1960, from which it will be seen that further donations totalling £2,416 15s. 8d. have been received.

Payments to the Game Preservation and Hunting Association of N. Rhodesia amounted to $\pounds 1,400$, which together with $\pounds 110 1s. 6d.$, cost of Equipment supplied, make a total contribution of $\pounds 1,510 1s. 6d.$

After deducting $\pounds 142$ 0s. 1d. expenses, there was a cash balance remaining of $\pounds 1,207$ 10s. 5d. at 31st December, 1960, from which a further donation of $\pounds 1,000$ was made in January, 1961.
