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### PSA PRIZES FOR YOUNG SCHOLARS

The Philosophy of Science Association is happy to announce that the prizes for young scholars will again be offered in 1997. The first of these is for an essay written by a graduate sutdent; the second is for an essay by someone who has received the Ph.D. within the last five years. Essays may be on any topic in the philosophy of science, and should be submitted to the Editor-in-Chief of *Philosophy of Science* before September 1 1997. The essays entered will be judged by a committee of three senior members of the PSA.

Winners in each category will receive \$250, and the winning essays will be published in *Philosophy of Science*. A person who is eligible to enter may submit for consideration an essay already accepted for publication in *Philosophy of Science* within the period September 1 1996 to September 1 1997. When the winning essays are published, they will be accompanied by an announcement to the effect that they were judged the best in this year's competition.

The financial support for the prizes has been made possible by the generosity of past presidents of the PSA.

### PRIZE WINNERS 1996

The prize for an essay submitted by a graduate student was awarded to Cameron Shelly for "Visual Abductive Reasoning in Archeology", which appeared in *Philosophy of Science* in June 1996.
