RULES RELATING TO MEMBERSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 3. (a) Members shall be divided into three classes:—
- (1) Resident Members; those who usually reside or have a place of business within the London Postal Area.
- (2) Non-resident Members; those who usually reside outside, and have not a place of business within, the above-stated Area.
- (3) Honorary Members and Foreign Extraordinary Members admitted as hereinafter provided.
- (b) Members in the first two classes are hereinafter designated Ordinary Members.
- 4. Any person desirous of becoming an Ordinary Member must be nominated by one Member and seconded by another, of whom one must act on a personal knowledge that the candidate is likely to be a suitable and useful Member; and the nominating Member shall address the Secretary in writing and give the candidate's name, address, and occupation, or status, and shall state to which of the aforesaid classes the candidate desires to be admitted.

19. An Ordinary Member may compound for all future annual subscriptions by paying in lieu thereof one sum calculated according to the Member's age and category as follows:—

This work, originally published in 1900, is now re-issued in its original form, but with one additional feature, several emendations and some excision of the, in places, superabundant footnote material. The new feature is a restoration of the oldest feature in the text: the Abhidhammanātikā. This is presumably the Mātikā of the Vinaya allusions, or thematic table. It is very possibly the germ out of which the Abhidhamma-Pitaka developed. Of the emendations the most noteworthy is the substitution of "synergies" for "syntheses" as a better equivalent for sankhārā. Much of the footnote discussion had become superfluous by the issue of P. Maung Tin's English translation of the Commentary: "The Expositor," 1920-1, as well as by that of other works of research. The Indexes have been rewritten, giving reference to sections, and not to pages (except for the Introductory Essay), hence they are valid for both editions.


