## APPOINTMENTS OF REPRESENTATIVES MADE BY

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
Prof. J. J. Nassau and Prof. P. Th. Oosterhoff represented the I.A.U. at the seventh General Assembly of the International Council of Scientific Unions (I.C.S.U.) at Oslo in 1955. At the eighth meeting of the Executive Board of I.C.S.U. at Bagnères-de-Bigorre in 1956 the I.A.U. was represented by Prof. A. Danjon and Sir Harold Spencer Jones and at the ninth meeting of this board in Brussels in 1957 by Prof. A. Danjon and Prof. P. Th. Oosterhoff.

In 1955 Prof. M. Waldmeier represented the I.A.U. at the centenary celebration of the Eidgenössische Technische Hochschule in Zürich.

At the twelfth General Assembly of the International Union for Scientific Radio (U.R.S.I.) at Boulder in 1957 the I.A.U. was represented by Prof. J. L. Pawsey, while Prof. C. S. Beals was the official delegate to the eleventh General Assembly of the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics (I.U.G.G.) in Toronto in the same year.

On behalf of the I.A.U. Dr J. Rösch attended a meeting of the commission for Aerology of the World Meteorological Organization in Paris in 1957.

The Executive Committee appointed Dr N. Stoyko and Dr W. Markowitz as representatives of the I.A.U. on the Consultative Committee for the Definition of the Second of the Bureau International des Poids et Mesures.

Prof. A. Danjon was appointed representative of the I.A.U. on the board of the International Foundation of the Pic-du-Midi, while Prof. A. Danjon and Prof. M. Waldmeier were appointed to represent the I.A.U. on the Council of the Federation of Astronomical, Geodetical and Geophysical Permanent Services.

Prof. O. Struve and Prof. O. Heckmann were appointed as I.A.U. representatives on the Editorial Board of the I.C.S.U. Review.

As Sir Harold Spencer Jones could not represent the I.A.U. on the Special Committee for the International Geophysical Year after he became General Secretary of I.C.S.U., the Executive Committee appointed Dr Y. Ohman in his place. In the I.A.U. two consultative groups were formed, which can be consulted by the two official representatives, Prof. A. Danjon and Dr Y. Ohman. These consultative groups have been composed as follows: Dr E. P. Fedorov, Dr W. Markowitz and Mr D. H. Sadler for questions concerning time, longitude and latitude and Dr C. W. Allen, Dr L. d'Azambuja, Prof. J. L. Pawsey, Prof. R. O. Redman, Prof. G. Righini and Dr W. O. Roberts for questions concerning solar observations.

At present the I.A.U. is represented on three Joint Commissions of I.C.S.U., as follows:
Joint Commission on the Ionosphere: Prof. V. G. Fesenkov, Prof. D. H. Menzel and Dr J. L. Pawsey;

Joint Commission on Solar and Terrestrial Relationships: Dr L. d'Azambuja, Dr M. A. Ellison, Prof. G. Righini and Prof. M. Waldmeier;

Joint Commission on Spectroscopy; Prof. B. Edlén, Prof. G. Herzberg, Dr W. F. Meggers, Dr C. E. Moore-Sitterly and Prof. G. Racah.

## MEETINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

In the years which are covered by this report the Executive Committee met twice, on 28 August and 3 September 1955, in Dublin on the occasion of the ninth General Assembly and once in Liège on 4-6 July 1957. The decisions taken at the meetings in Dublin were mostly concerned with the ninth General Assembly and have been incorporated in the report on this assembly, which has been published in the ninth volume of the Transactions.

The following took part in the meeting in Liège: A. Danjon (President), A. Couder (Vice-President), O. Heckmann (Vice-President), B. V. Kukarkin (Vice-President), E. Rybka (Vice-President), P. Swings (Vice-President), R. v. d. R. Woolley (VicePresident), P. Th. Oosterhoff (General Secretary) and, in an advisory capacity, O. Struve (former President). P. G. Kulikovsky attended the meetings as a guest. The agenda of

the meeting included the following items: financial status of the Union and grants-in-aid from U.N.E.S.C.O.; the next General Assembly and future symposia; the General Assembly of rg6r; proposals for a change in the structure of some standing commissions; the formation of F.A.G.G.S. (the Federation of Astronomical, Geodetical and Geophysical Permanent Services) ; the nomination of an Assistant General Secretary; and some other items.

The time of the tenth General Assembly, which will be held in Moscow, was fixed as from 13 August until, and including, 20 August 1958. It was decided that in connexion with this assembly three symposia will be organized. The first of these, on Radio Astronomy, will be held in France under the combined auspices of U.R.S.I. and I.A.U. The place of the meeting will probably be Paris, the time about one week before the Moscow Assembly. Prof. J. L. Pawsey, the President of Commission 40, was appointed first representative of the I.A.U. on the organizing committee. The Executive Committee further decided that two symposia will be held during the assembly. The topics of these symposia will be: 'The Rotation of the Earth and Atomic Time Standards' and 'The Hertzsprung-Russell Diagram', and the organizing committees will consist of: Dr A. A. Mikhailov (President), Dr G. M. Clemence, Dr E. P. Fedorov, Dr W. Markowitz and Dr P. Melchior; and Dr J. L. Greenstein (President), Dr P. P. Parenago, Dr E. Schatzman and Dr O . Struve respectively.

The Executive Committee agreed that time should be reserved during the assembly for some Joint Discussions.

As the General Secretary has decided to resign at the next assembly, the Executive committee nominated Mr D. H. Sadler as Assistant General Secretary.

Some proposals were received and discussed by the Executive Committee concerning a change in the structure of some of the existing standing commissions and the formation of a new commission. It was decided to submit these proposals to the next General Assembly.

Bulgaria was admitted as a member of the I.A.U. Its adhering organization will be the Bulgarian Academy of Science at Sofia.

Prof. M. G. J. Minnaert was appointed President of the Nominating Committee.
The Executive Committee decided to increase the annual dues to the International Council of Scientific Unions from one to two per cent of the Union's proper income in conformity with the request of I.C.S.U. and the decisions taken by the other Unions.

It was also decided that the I.A.U. will adhere to the International Foundation of the Pic-du-Midi and Prof. A. Danjon was appointed as representative for the I.A.U. on the board of this new foundation.

In June 1956 the Executive Board of I.C.S.U. established the Federation of Astronomical, Geodetical and Geophysical Services (F.A.G.G.S.). This new federation will receive a special annual subvention from U.N.E.S.C.O. in order to give financial assistance to the permanent services of the Unions concerned; the permanent services of I.A.U., I.U.G.G. and U.R.S.I. have been incorporated in the new federation. The permanent services of the I.A.U. which will receive subventions from F.A.G.G.S. are the Bureau International de l'Heure, the International Latitude Service and the Quarterly Bulletin on Solar Activity. The Executive Committee appointed Prof. A. Danjon and Prof. M. Waldmeier as representatives of the I.A.U. on the council of the federation.

## SYMPOSIA

In connexion with the ninth General Assembly in Dublin three symposia were held. The first on 'Radio Astronomy' took place at the Jodrell Bank Experimental Station near Manchester from 25 to 27 August 1955; the others on 'Non-stable Stars' and on 'Comparison of the large-scale Structure of the Galactic System with that of other Stellar Systems' were held during the General Assembly in Dublin. Reports on these symposia have been published in three volumes of the new I.A.U. symposium series, namely Symposium volume no. 3 on Non-Stable Stars, Symposium no. 4 on Radio Astronomy and Symposium no. 5 on Comparison of the Large-Scale Structure of the Galactic System with that of other Stellar Systems.

In 1956, a symposium was held in Stockholm from 27 to 31 August on ' Electromagnetic Phenomena in Cosmical Physics'. The organizing committee for this symposium consisted of: H. Alfvén (Chairman), H. W. Babcock, L. Biermann and T. G. Cowling. We are greatly indebted to the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics and to the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics, which Unions were so kind to allocate subventions to the I.A.U. of $\$ 1500$ and $\$ 750$ respectively, to cover part of the travel expenses of the participants. A report on this symposium will be published as symposium volume no. 6 of the I.A.U. under the editorship of Dr B. Lehnert.

In 1957, a second symposium on 'Co-ordination of Galactic Research' was held in Saltsjöbaden from 17 to 22 June. The organizing committee consisted of: A. Blaauw, W. Baade, B. Lindblad, J. H. Oort (Chairman), P. P. Parenago and P. J. van Rhijn. A report on this symposium will be published in volume no. 7 of the I.A.U. symposium series.

In the same year a third symposium on 'Cosmical Gas Dynamics' was held in Cambridge, U.S.A. from 24 to 29 June under the combined auspices of the International Union for Theoretical and Applied Mechanics and the I.A.U. The organizing committee was composed as follows: for the I.A.U., S. Chandrasekhar, J. H. Oort, L. Spitzer and H. C. van de Hulst and for the I.U.T.A.M., G. K. Batchelor, J. M. Burgers, A. R. Kantrowitz, G. I. Taylor and G. E. Uhlenbeck. The report on this symposium will be printed in Reviews of Modern Physics and reprinted as volume no. 8 in the I.A.U. symposium series.

The I.A.U. is very grateful to U.N.E.S.C.O. and I.C.S.U. for allocating important grants-in-aid towards part of the travelling and subsistence expenses connected with these symposia.

The symposia planned for the tenth General Assembly have already been mentioned in the section on meetings of the Executive Committee.

In this year a sum of \$2000, transferred by virement from 1956 to 1957, was available in addition to the subvention mentioned above.

For the first time no subvention from U.N.E.S.C.O. was received in 1957 through the intermediary of I.C.S.U. for the permanent services of the I.A.U., namely for the Bureau International de l'Heure, for the Quarterly Bulletin on Solar Activity and for the International Latitude Service. A new body was established, namely, the Federation of Astronomical, Geodetical and Geophysical Services, F.A.G.G.S., in which the permanent services of I.U.G.G., U.R.S.I. and I.A.U. are incorporated. As from 1957 this new federation received subventions direct from U.N.E.S.C.O. and I.C.S.U. to finance the permanent services of the Unions mentioned above. The Bureau International de l'Heure received in this year a subvention of $\$ 8000$, the International Latitude Service a subvention of $\$ 4500$ and the Quarterly Bulletin on Solar Activity a subvention of $\$ 1500$. In connexion with the International Geophysical Year, some of the permanent services had to develop a much larger activity than normal with a resulting increase in their expenses; the Bureau International de l'Heure received a special subvention for 1957 to the amount of $\$ 6000$, which however had not yet been paid at the end of the financial year 1956-57.

The financial support given by U.N.E.S.C.O. to the I.A.U. has been of the greatest importance to the Union. The I.A.U. is greatly indebted to U.N.E.S.C.O. and I.C.S.U. and to their officers who have given most efficient help in connexion with these grants. The I.A.U. is especially grateful to Dr Ronald Fraser, administrative secretary of I.C.S.U., and to the General Secretary of I.C.S.U.

Several large and small volumes have been published during the period covered by this report under the auspices and with financial aid from the I.A.U. The financial aid received from U.N.E.S.C.O. for this activity is herewith gratefully acknowledged.

THE FINANCIAL SITUATION
At the General Assembly in Dublin, in September 1955, it was decided that the unit of subscription for the years 1956-58 be fixed again at 500 gold francs, the gold franc being defined in accordance with the Statutes of the International Council of Scientific Unions, Vol. 3, p. 107, 1937, as 0.2903225 g . fine gold, or 0.3266 U.S. dollar.

The detailed reports of the accounts of the I.A.U. in four different currencies for the years 1955, 1956 and 1957 are to be found at the end of this report. Each financial year covers the period from I November until 3I October. Consequently the financial account for 1955 covers the twelve months elapsed from 1 November 1954 until 3I October 1955, and so on. The Union has now only accounts in dollars, in sterling, in French francs and in Dutch guilders.

On I November 1957 the unexpended balance was $\$ 103245.88$. For the conversion of the different currencies into dollars the following rates have been used:

Of this unexpended balance a sum of $\$ 39993.47$ has been invested in savings-accounts, the remaining sum of $\$ 63252.41$ is composed of the balances of the four bank-accounts. It is to be kept in mind that the balances of the dollar-accounts, as given at the end of this report, include not only the actual balance of the bank-account in dollars, but also the money, which has been put into savings-accounts.

Part of the unexpended balance however must be considered as committed for publications which are being printed at the moment, and for other purposes. The total amount committed is estimated to be approximately $\$ 30000$. Therefore on I November 1957 the net balance is of the order of $\$ 73000$, which means a small increase as compared with the net balance in the financial report published in the ninth volume of the Transactions.

The total income from subscriptions now equals 122 units or $\$ 19922 \cdot 60$ annually. The average annual subvention from U.N.E.S.C.O. during the last three years amounted to $\$ 15800$, but in 1957 special subventions were received through the intermediary of F.A.G.G.S. to the amount of $\$ 9500$.

If U.N.E.S.C.O. does not decrease its subventions to the I.A.U. drastically, the I.A.U. may count in the coming years on an annual income of about $\$ 20$ ooo from subscriptions and of about $\$ 24000$ from U.N.E.S.C.O. The financial situation of the I.A.U. may therefore be considered as satisfactory. The co-operation of National Committees and Adhering Organizations in these financial matters is herewith gratefully acknowledged.

On the whole, payment of subscriptions is up-to-date and only some countries have arrears of a few years.

The amounts paid in the years 1955, i956 and 1957 on annual grants are given in the following table (cf. for 1955, Trans. I.A.U.8, 65; and for 1956 and 1957, Trans. I.A.U. 9, $66)$. The annual subvention for the Bureau will be discussed below.

## Remarks

Commission 5 (Astronomical News Letters): The annual subvention was due in 1956 and in 1957. Before that time a special subvention had been allocated, which has been accounted for in Vol. 9 of the Transactions. From the accounts at the end of this report, it can be seen that subscriptions to the Astronomical News Letters yield an annual income of somewhat over $\$ 500$, the profit from subscriptions being $\$ 474$ in 1956 and $\$ 567$ in 1957.

Commission 5 (Bibliographie Mensuelle): This payment consists of the annual subvention for the three years of this report and of a sum of $\$ 653$ for the years 1946 and 1952-54. The commitment of $\$ 326$, mentioned on p. 4 I of Transactions, Vol. 9 was erroneous and amounted to $\$ 653$, which has now been paid.

Commission io (Quarterly Bulletin on Solar Activity): The annual subvention of $\$ 1500$ has been paid only once, namely in 1956. Before that time special subventions allocated by the Executive Committee were paid for this purpose, which have been accounted for in Vol. 9 of the Transactions. In 1957 the Quarterly Bulletin has received its subvention of $\$ 1500$ from the Federation of Astronomical, Geodetical and Geophysical Services (F.A.G.G.S.).

Commission 1 (Cartes synoptiques): This payment covers the annual subvention over the years 1955, 1956 and 1957 and in addition a sum of $\$ 408$, which is the difference between the total amount of subventions voted for the years 1946 to 1954 inclusive and the sums actually paid in these years.

Commission 20 (Centre des Petites Planètes) : This payment is the subvention for the year 1956, which proved adequate for the operation of the Centre until the end of 1957.

Commission 27 (Liste des Noms d'Etoiles Variables): This payment was made in 1955. After Dublin no annual subvention has been voted for this purpose, although these publications will return again at irregular intervals.

Commission 31 (Bureau de l'Heure): This payment consists of the subventions for the years 1955 and 1956. In 1957 the Bureau International de l'Heure received its annual subvention direct from F.A.G.G.S.

Commission 38 (Echange des Astronomes) : The annual subvention for Commission 38 is never paid to the Commission, but following instructions from its President, the secretariat takes care of payments of travel grants. The sum mentioned above is the actual amount paid by the Union. The difference between the sums voted for Commission 38 and the payments actually made is given below in the section of commitments. Part of the payments by Commission 38 in 1955, namely $\$ 4546 \cdot 37$, were made for young astronomers participating in the Dublin General Assembly.

Commission 5 (Observatoires et Astronomes): This payment includes the two special subventions voted in Rome and in Dublin.

Commission 19 (Publication des Résultats de la Variation des Latitudes): This special subvention was voted at the Zürich General Assembly in 1948.

Commission 23 (Astrographic Catalogue): The special subvention to the Astrographic Catalogue is never paid to the Commission, but the secretariat pays the bills for typing and printing. The difference between the sums voted in the past and the expenses actually incurred will be given in the section of commitments.

Bureau (Publication of Symposia): The specification of this sum is as follows:

The expenses for Symposium No. 2, which was published by I.U.T.A.M. and I.A.U. through the North Holland Publishing Company at the risk of the company, were incurred in order that the I.A.U. could provide copies free of charge to the institutes on its mailing list.

The expenses for publication of symposia are considerably higher than the subvention of $\$ 2200$ voted by the General Assembly in Dublin. It was a decision of the Executive Committee (see Trans. I.A.U.9, 35, first paragraph) that henceforth symposia organized by the I.A.U. shall be published in a new separate series of publications. On I November 1957 four volumes had been published, while three others were at that time at the printer. The subvention of $\$ 2200$ voted by the General Assembly in 1955 has clearly been based on too optimistic an estimate. The question therefore arises whether this decision of the Executive Committee should be maintained in the future. It is to be expected that on the average two symposia will have to be published annually.

However, during the three years covered by this report, a number of volumes of I.A.U. publications has been sold each year and the profit from sales has not been accounted for in the figures given above. The income from sales of I.A.U. publications amounts to:

These sales include all I.A.U. publications. It is clear from these figures that the income in 1956 and 1957 was considerably larger than in 1955. This is due to the fact that in 1956 and 1957 a considerable number of symposium volumes and of Vol. 9 of the Transactions has been sold. Sales of symposium volumes, which deal with a typically astronomical topic, are usually moderate. A much larger sale can be expected for volumes which are also of interest to physicists and scientists in other fields of research. We do

not yet know, however, how large the income from sale will be for such volumes as the symposium no. 4 on Radio Astronomy, as this book was distributed in the autumn of 1957.

The total expenses on the Bureau of the Union amounted in this period to $\$ 40526.20$. A detailed list of the expenses for the Bureau follows here:


## Remarks

Travel expenses, Young Astronomers in connexion with the Dublin General Assembly: the total sum paid to assist Young Astronomers to attend the Dublin Assembly amounted to the figure mentioned here plus the sum of $\$ 4546 \cdot 37$ mentioned under annual subventions, Commission 38.

Travel expenses for Symposium, Electromagnetic Phenomena in Cosmical Physics: of the travel expenses mentioned here a sum of $\$ 1500$ was reimbursed by the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics. The International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics paid a sum of $\$ 750$, but this payment is not included in this account, as it was paid direct to the organizing committee in Stockholm to cover subsistence expenses of all participants.

Travel expenses for Symposium, Cosmical Gas Dynamics: the travel expenses in connexion with the symposium were paid by the two organizing Unions, the International Union of Theoretical and Applied Mechanics and the I.A.U. The figure given here is the share of the I.A.U. in the total travel expenses.

According to the votes by the General Assembly the Bureau could use a sum of $\$ 4899$ in 1955 and a subvention of $\$ 6000$ in the years 1956 and r957 each. Consequently the sum voted for the Bureau for the term of three years covered by this report amounted to $\$ 16899$, whereas the total expenses for the Bureau were $\$ 40526$, as given above. In this connexion it should be kept in mind, however, that for several activities of the Bureau subventions have been received from U.N.E.S.C.O. Applications for U.N.E.S.C.O.

subventions have to be made according to categories: Category I (Administrative expenses), Category 2 (Publications), Category 3 (Meetings), Category 4 (Symposia), Category 5 (Permanent Services). As soon as the subvention has been allocated the Union is absolutely free in spending the money according to its own needs, as long as payments can be brought under one of the categories mentioned above.

Among the expenses of the Bureau we find travel expenses in connexion with a General Assembly and with several symposia, a meeting of the Executive Committee and the publication of the Transactions. For all these items we received considerable grants from U.N.E.S.C.O., but a part of the U.N.E.S.C.O. subventions can also be used for Category 2 (publications) and therefore for several of the items mentioned above under annual and special subventions.

It would be completely arbitrary to divide the U.N.E.S.C.O. subventions received in these three years over the items under annual subventions, special subventions or expenses of the Bureau.

The following subventions voted by the General Assembly have not yet been paid and should be considered as commitments:


In computing these commitments we have not counted payments which are normally due after November 1957. On the other hand we have included the cost of publications of symposia which were held before the date mentioned above, although the publications will not be ready for distribution until well after the close of the financial year 1957 . The commitments for publications of symposia are rather uncertain estimates.
