Tools and the Man

by Dr. W. B. WRIGHT, late of H.M. Geological Survey

Believing that Archaeology and Geology are inextricably interwoven, Dr. Wright, author of *THE QUARTERNARY ICE AGE*, has studied recent work on Archaeology and discusses its bearing on the Ice Ages. He attempts to give all that is important in modern stone-age typology. Recently we have witnessed some remarkable advances in the study of stone implements, and important discoveries have been made about their relation to geological deposits. The literature is difficult of access and there is a real need for a book, such as this, presenting the essentials of the subject. Above all this book aims to be a reliable guide to what is known rather than imagined regarding early man.
