OLYMPIA: Its History and Remains. By E. NORMAN GARDINER. Crown 4to, with 130 illustrations. 50s. net.

Chapters on The Destruction and Recovery of Olympia; The Geography, the Prehistoric Remains, and the Peoples and Cults of the North-west Peloponnese; The Origin of the Olympic Festival; Olympia and Pisa; Olympia and Elis; Olympia and Macedon; Olympia and Rome; The Topography of the Altis; The Altars, Temples, the Treasuries, and Official and Athletic Buildings of Olympia; The Exedra and the Water Supply; The Olympic Festival.

EAST CHRISTIAN ART. A Survey of the Monuments. By O. M. Dalton. 4to, with 70 plates. 105s. net.

The primary purpose of this book is to give an objective survey of the monuments on lines similar to those adopted in *Byzantiue Art and Archaeology*, though with the addition of a chapter on Architecture. Criticism of works of Art as such has been avoided, but the endeavour has been made to trace the influences which lend East Christian Art its character. The plates have been chosen to illustrate artistic achievement in the most varied fields.

MUHAMMADAN ARCHITECTURE IN EGYPT AND PALES-TINE. By Martin S. Briggs. Demy 4to, with 79 plates and 55 diagrams. 84s. net.

Describing in detail, and for the first time in English, the architecture of the Middle Ages in Cairo, Jerusalem, Damascus, and the smaller cities of Egypt and Palestine. Throughout the volume the author traces the influence of history, religion, and climate on architecture; he shows the results of intercourse between East and West; and includes an essay on the nature of Saracenic ornament. The various branches of craftsmanship are treated separately, and the book is made helpful to the student by the inclusion of bibliographies, an index, and a glossary.

PUEBLO POTTERY MAKING. A study at the Village of San Ildefonso. By C. E. GUTHE. (Papers of the Southwestern Expedition, No.2.) 4to, with 35 plates and 11 figures in the text. 18s. 6d. net. Yale University Press.

San Ildefonso is a typical Pueblo town in New Mexico, where the mode of life and the arts practised at the present day are almost identical with those of a thousand years ago. This study is therefore of high importance to the archaeologist as well as to the student of present-day cultures and manufactures.
