

During the preceding 12 months (through Oct. 10, 1985) the average number of copies printed for each issue was 3,479; the average paid circulation, 3,332; the average free distribution, 30; the average number of copies distributed 3,362. Corresponding figures for the last issue before filing: 3,300 total number of copies printed; 3,270 total paid circulation; 30 free copies distributed; 3,300 total distribution.
