Jan Huygen van Linschoten was a Dutchman who, in 1596, penned the famous *Itinerario*, an account of his travel to the Indian Peninsula and its eastern surroundings that described the inhabitants of this vast region and quickly became a travel guide for everyone going there. In 1604 he published an abridged version, the *Icones et Habitus Indorum*, which contained 36 of the engravings from the *Itinerario* together with Latin captions. This book reproduces these engravings and their captions (in English), together with an extensive analysis of them by historian Ernst van den Boogaart.
