



Jan Huygen van Linschoten was a Dutchman who, in 1596, penned the famous *ltinerario*, an account of his travel to the Indian Peninsula and its eastern surroundings that described the inhabitants of this vast region and quickly became a travel guide for everyone going there. In 1604 he published an abridged version, the *lcones et Habitus Indorum*, which contained 36 of the engravings from the *ltinerario* together with Latin captions.
