This is the first modern analytical study of Central Italian prehistory and it is also one of only half-a-dozen regional multi-period analyses for prehistoric Europe as a whole. The cultural material is illustrated in some detail to support the argument and there are very detailed maps of each period of settlement, which are supported by a comprehensive gazetteer of sites, with a full bibliography. While a general acquaintance with European archaeology would be helpful, specialist knowledge of Central Italian prehistory is not assumed: the theories are explained fully, the argument is easy to follow, and the problems are relevant to any general study of change in prehistoric societies. Prehistorians interested in Early Man, anthropologists, and students of Old World history at every level will join with archaeologists generally in welcoming this book.

Hugh Last Fund

The income from the Hugh Last Fund, estimated to be in the region of £1,300 per annum, is available for the general scholarly purposes of the Roman Society, which are to promote the study of the history, archaeology, literature and art of Italy and the Roman Empire, from the earliest times down to about A.D. 700. Under the terms of reference, however, the following are *excluded*:

'any archaeological or other excavations or surveys, . . . travelling, hotel, conference and other living expenses of scholars or research into or studies on the subjects of Roman Britain and the archaeology of the provinces in Western Europe.'

Applications for research grants are invited for financial assistance towards the undertaking, completion or publication of special work. Normally this assistance would be given to applicants of post-doctoral status. Applications for personal grants or for assistance in publication may be made by 1st March or 1st October in any year. They should be sent to the Secretary, Society for the Promotion of Roman Studies, 31-34 Gordon Square, London WC1H 0PP, from whom further particulars may be obtained.

The Classical Association

THE main aims of the Classical Association are to promote and sustain interest in classical studies, to maintain their rightful position in universities and schools, and to give scholars and teachers opportunities of meeting and discussing their problems. It organizes an annual conference, lasting four or five days, in a university centre, and sponsors over thirty branches, most of which hold Greek and Latin Reading Competitions for Schools. Its activities are fully reported in its annual *Proceedings*, issued free to all members.

The present membership of the Association is approximately 4,000. Membership is open both to individuals and to institutions at an annual subscription of £1; life composition for individual members, £21. Members may obtain the *Classical Review* and *Classical Quarterly* at reduced prices (*Review* £12, *Quarterly* £13; combined subscription, £21). *Greece and Rome* may also be obtained through the Association for an annual subscription of £8.75.
